if you ve ever studied acting if you ve ever taught acting if you ve ever tried to understand why people love acting and need to pursue it either as a professional or as a devoted amateur this book was written with you in mind venturing into the world of professional theatre requires a special way of thinking and a proper understanding and acceptance of the challenges to be met and overcome young actors with powerful dreams about a glamorous career on broadway or in film and tv media often embark on their journeys with little knowledge of the mindset necessary in order to give them the best opportunities to survive and succeed and often the families and teachers who want to support their dreams and ambitions know even less after a successful professional acting and teaching career spanning nearly 50 years 20 of which were spent helming one of the most prestigious high school theatre preparatory programs in america dr montee gives specific advice for ambitious young actors their teachers and their nervous families in this collection of essays born of decades of experiences working with students many of whom have gone on to successful careers in a variety of professions artistic and otherwise covering subjects that range from preparing audition material to initially encountering shakespeare to laying a foundation for beginning directors to ultimately deciding if the life of a professional actor is really for you don t put your daughter on the stage provides valuable perspectives for anyone interested in exploring a life in the theatre either as a professional or as a devoted

amateur as well as offering gentle counsel for the teachers and families who love them

the first step is simply to ask why do i act there is no easy answer nor should there be this book merely offers helpful tools for the young actor to begin the work of asking the question it contains a conversation with two working actors some monologues to act with and some insight from a real broadway producer

lights up on four kids trapped in a basement surrounded by killer penguins or two filthy rich aristocrats racing each other around the world or a supervillain s parents unexpectedly drop by to check out her new secret lair welcome to the unpredictable pages of lights up a compilation of short scenes begging to be performed by enthusiastic young actors looking for fun and lively characters to play on stage dive into 20 mini plays that are perfect for all types from the seasoned thespian to the beginning drama student and can be acted out before an audience of hundreds a small classroom or in the family living room each ridiculous story will have young actors excited to jump on stage eager to play these big characters scenes range from two to eight roles and can be costumed and staged with a budget of hundreds or pocket change a note from the author i believe that young actors are dying to play strong characters it s probably one of the main reasons why they re experimenting with theatre at this time in their lives to be someone and or something completely different from what they are in real life so let them encourage them to play lights up gives them these far out characters to perform they can have a blast performing as the hungry cannibal the saucy hologram the dumb caveman the angry genie or the time traveling high schooler so grab some friends cast the show and go out and entertain the world

befriending berth centers on three children a boy who can t stop talking a girl who can barely speak and another girl who claims to drive her own cadillac drawn into an unlikely bond they weave a web of fantasy and drama in which they seek refuge from the problems they face in reality when these two worlds collide each of the kids must face the challenge of dealing with truth while keeping hope alive book jacket

for the first time a collection of monologues to work on in dialect challenging monologues which require dialect have been compiled in this new work from smith kraus in sections with an introduction and description of each dialect
