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conceiving of christianity as a worldview has been one of the most significant events in the church in the last 150 years in this new book david naugle provides the best discussion yet of the history and contemporary use of worldview as a totalizing approach to faith and life this informative volume first locates the origin of worldview in the writings of immanuel kant and surveys the rapid proliferation of its use throughout the english speaking world naugle then provides the first study ever undertaken of the insights of major western philosophers on the subject of worldview and offers an original examination of the role this concept has played in the

worldview religious studies brings the study of religion spirituality secularism and other mixed attitudes of life under the overarching scheme of worldview studies this book introduces and defines worldviews more generally before establishing a framework specific to religious studies the drive for meaning making is explored through ritual symbolic activities ideas of play and the power of emotions to transform simple ideas into values and beliefs that frame identity and signpost destiny identity and its

sacralisation are discussed alongside gift reciprocity theory in their relation to ideas of merit karma and salvation in eastern and western traditions this theoretical background is used to introduce a new classification of worldviews natural scientific ancestral karmic prophetic sectarian mystical and ideological organised thematically by chapter this book brings together familiar and unfamiliar authors theories and sources to challenge students and teachers of religious studies theology and ethics it introduces worldview religious studies as a framework through which to re think human endeavours to identify cope and even transcend life s flaws and perils

this book an edited compilation of twenty nine essays focuses on the difference s that a christian worldview makes for the disciplines or subject areas normally taught in liberal arts colleges and universities three initial chapters of introductory material are followed by twenty six essays each dealing with the essential elements or issues in the academic discipline involved these individual essays on each discipline are a unique element of this book these essays also treat some of the specific differences in perspective or procedure that a biblically informed christian perspective brings to each discipline christian worldview and the academic disciplines is intended principally as an introductory textbook in christian worldview courses for christian college or university students this volume will also be of interest to christian students in secular post secondary institutions who may be encountering challenges to their faith both implicit and explicit from peers or professors who assume that holding a strong christian faith and pursuing a rigorous college or university education are essentially incompatible this book should also be helpful for college and university professors who embrace the christian faith but whose post secondary academic background because of its secular orientation has left them inadequately prepared to intelligently apply the implications of their faith to their particular academic specialty such specialists be they professors or upper level graduate students will find the extensive bibliographies of recent scholarship at the end of the individual chapters particularly helpful

with the loss of many of the world s languages it is important to question what will be lost to humanity with their demise it is frequently argued that a language engenders a worldview but what do we mean by this term attributed to german politician and philologist wilhelm von humboldt 1767 1835 the term has since been adopted by numerous linguists within specialist circles it has become associated with what is known as the sapir whorf hypothesis which suggests that the nature of a language influences the thought of its speakers and that different language patterns yield different patterns of thought underhill s concise and rigorously researched book clarifies the main ideas and proposals of humboldt s linguistic philosophy and demonstrates the way his ideas can be adopted and adapted by thinkers and linguists today a detailed glossary of terms is provided in order to clarify key concepts and to translate the german terms used by humboldt

this text was originally published in 2004 as a provisional road map gesturing to a plan of action for liberation at the level of the idea vitally compulsory to dismantle the hegemony of the white world order of power in the 21st century since 2004 deconstruction of the oeuvre of frantz fanon michel foucault derek walcott the discourse of massa of african enslavement in the caribbean and the thought of xi jinping for the new era have been published which has changed the nature of the road map today versus that of 2004 an extensive revision of the text of 2004 was now necessary which focuses on the the nature of hallucinatory whiteness that afflicts

non white peoples under the hegemony of massa white world order of power thereby rendering them incapable of liberating themselves at the level of the idea the need now was to uncover hallucinatory whiteness as it constitutes human action and how the nature of this action is the product of hallucinatory whiteness hence it reinforces white hegemony over the non white person at the level of the idea to this end a deconstruction of the writings of toussaint l ouverture of the haitian revolution george jackson of the african revolution of amerikkka and skin bleaching in the caribbean in the 21st century are presented as case studies illustrating potentially the debilitating power hallucinatory whiteness wields over the mind of non white persons who insist they are champions of liberation which drives the resilience of massa hegemony over non white peoples of the world

this book provides a comprehensive investigation into hans morgenthau s life and work identifying power knowledge and dissent as the fundamental principles that have informed his worldview this book argues that morgenthau s lasting contribution to the discipline of international relations is the human condition of politics

darwin s theory of evolution by natural selection is considered in its application to human beings in this book brian baxter examines the various sociobiological approaches to the explanation of human behaviour which view the human brain and so the human mind as the product of evolution and considers the main arguments for and against this claim in so doing he defends the approaches against some common criticisms such as the charge that they are reductionist and dehumanising the implications of these arguments for the social sciences and humanities are assessed as is the naturalistic view of ethics to which they lead a key issue examined in the book is the connection between this darwinist perspective on human beings and modern environmental ethics which also often assume that human beings are part of an evolved living world the implications of these positions for the meaningfulness of human life are also examined throughout the discussion the positions in sociobiology and environmental ethics developed by edward o wilson are taken as an exemplar of the characteristic features of a darwinian worldview and the arguments of wilson and his chief critics are thoroughly examined
