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five architects originally published in 1975 grew out of a meeting of the case group conference of architects for the study of the environment held at the museum of modern art in 1969 the purpose of this gathering was to exhibit and criticize the work of five architects eisenman graves gwathmey hejduk and meier who constituted a new york school and who are now among the most influential architects working today the buildings shown here have more diversity than one might expect from a school but share certain properties of form scale and treatment of material collectively their work makes a modest claim it is only architecture not the salvation of man and the redemption of the earth providing complete drawings and photographic documentation this collection also includes a comparative critique by kenneth frampton an introduction by colin rowe that suggests a still broader context for the work as a whole and two short texts in which individual positions are outlined now back in print five architects serves as a reference to the early work of some of america s most important architects and provides us with a glimpse back at the direction of architecture as they saw it over twenty years ago

fractal analysis is a method for measuring analysing and comparing the formal or geometric properties of complex objects in this book it is used to investigate eighty five buildings that have been designed by some of the twentieth century s most respected and celebrated architects including designs by le corbusier eileen gray frank lloyd wright robert venturi frank gehry peter eisenman richard meier and kazuyo sejima amongst others this book uses mathematics to analyse arguments and theories about some of the world s most famous designs starting with 625 reconstructed architectural plans and elevations and including more than 200 specially prepared views of famous buildings this book presents the results of the largest mathematical study ever undertaken into architectural design and the largest single application of fractal analysis presented in any field the data derived from this study is used to test three overarching hypotheses about social stylistic and personal trends in design along with five celebrated arguments about twentieth century architecture through this process the book offers a unique mathematical insight into the history and theory of design

this monograph explores the profound connections between architecture and mathematics through the works of andrea palladio le corbusier and peter eisenman combining historical insights with computational analyses it examines the social spatial and aesthetic properties of twenty six iconic designs advanced methods such as space syntax isovists fractal analysis image segmentation and semantic linguistic analysis reveal the mathematical principles underlying architectural thinking and properties richly illustrated with over 100 visuals this volume is an essential resource for senior undergraduates postgraduates practicing architects and historians seeking a deeper understanding of mathematical thinking in architectural design and analysis

how do we create the new from the old the architecture of influence explores this fundamental question by analyzing a broad swath of twentieth century architectural works including some of the best known examples of the architectural canon modern and postmodern through the lens of influence the book serves as both a critique of the discipline s long standing focus on genius and a celebration of the creative act of

revisioning and reimagining the past it argues that all works of architecture not only depend on the past but necessarily alter rewrite and reposition the traditions and ideas to which they refer organized into seven chapters replicas copies compilations generalizations revivals emulations and self repetitions the book redefines influence as an active process through which the past is defined recalled and subsequently redefined within twentieth century architecture

in both these respects peter eisenman differs not only from other architects of his own generation but from nearly all other architects working today

smart funny fearless it's pretty safe to say that *spy* was the most influential magazine of the 1980s it might have remade new york's cultural landscape it definitely changed the whole tone of magazine journalism it was cruel brilliant beautifully written and perfectly designed and feared by all there's no magazine i know of that's so continually referenced held up as a benchmark and whose demise is so lamented dave eggers it's a piece of garbage donald trump

this book offers a novel perspective on contemporary architecture exploring its position in mediatization attained through technological apparatuses it introduces the novel concepts of apparatus centrality and mediatization of architecture which have significant disciplinary and cultural ramifications highlighting key technological and theoretical developments the book's narrative traces the transformation of architecture from the modernist era to the present digital age en route it reflects on how architecture becomes a crucial element of shifting dispositives through its confluence with technologies of aestheticization and virtualization and by emblemizing ecological ideals it also illuminates the reconfiguring of architectural practice through examining surprising interactions and analogies between architecture and music whose developments in notation and codification continually change the relationship between composer and performer the book explores how architecture is reshaped by broader theory and practice in media and ultimately serves as a cognitive agent it underscores that architecture profoundly influences our phantasmagoric image driven affective

world through its increasingly apparatus centric approach to conception design production and mediatization architecture in the age of mediatizing technologies brings into focus the behavior of architecture in mediatization for researchers and advanced students in architectural design theory and history as an investigation into the interdisciplinary impact of architecture in a mediatized culture at large it also provides a valuable resource for cultural and media studies

building theories speaks to the value of words in architecture it addresses the author's fascination with the voices of architects engineers builders and craftspeople whose ideas about building have been captured in text it discusses the content of treatises essays articles and letters by those who have been throughout history committed to the art of building in this building theories argues for the return of a practice of architectural theory that is set amongst building buildings and builders this journey of close reading reinterprets the words of vitruvius alberti de l'orme le camus de mézières boullée laugier rondelet semper viollet le duc hübsch bötticher berlage muthesius wagner behrendt gropius and arup with chapters dedicated to texts from antiquity the renaissance and the nineteenth century and with a critical eye on architectural theory popularized in the anglo saxon world post 1968 readers are introduced to a wider more inclusive definition of architectural ideas building theories considers how contemporary scholarship has steered away from the topic of building in its reluctance to admit that both design and construction are central to its concerns in response it argues for a realignment of architecture with the concept of techné with a dual commitment to fabrica e ratio with a productive return to l'art de bien bastir with the accurate translation of the term baukunst and with an appeal to the architect's composite mind students practitioners and educators will identify in building theories ways of thinking that strive for the integration of design with construction reject the supposed primacy of the former over the latter recognize how aesthetics are an insufficient scaffold for subtending the subject of architectural ethics and accept without reservation that material transformations have always been at the origins of built form

this book brings together new and emerging perspectives on sustainability combining a series of well know authors in contemporary philosophy with established practitioners of sustainable design it develops a coherent theoretical framework for how a philosophy of sustainability might engage with the growing practice of sustainable design

a complete monograph of legendary and cult architect peter eisenman that sums up and fully illustrates his lifetime s achievement from his first work house i 1960 to his most recent projects currently under construction in the us spain and germany the book is centred on 63 of eisenman s most significant projects interspersed by essays from international architects

perhaps more than any other architect practicing today peter eisenman has made a career out of devising a dialectic of oppositions in architecture with references to societal alienation and existing architectural forms his work derives much from friedrich nietzsche noam chomsky and jacques derrida he led the loosely knit group of architects known as the new york five which included john hejduk michael graves charles gwathmey and richard meier who made an effort to introduce a theory and artistry of modernist architecture as rigorous as that of the european avant garde this is the first comprehensive single volume overview ever published on eisenman s buildings and projects from his first work house i 1960 to his most recent projects currently under construction in spain and germany the book includes all the projects eisenman has created with essays from international architects and critics including greg lynn sanford kwinter and stan allen eisenman currently teaches at new york s cooper union and at princeton university he has designed a wide range of projects including the wexner center at ohio state university which received a 1993 national honor award from the american institute of architects and the holocaust memorial in berlin which opened in spring 2005

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
