this book reviews the development and performance of the global film industry during the covid19 pandemic and examines new trends in film production distribution and consumption through a global lens the covid 19 pandemic has had a substantial impact on the global film industry since the beginning of 2020 there has been significant transformation in terms of film production distribution and consumption hollywood as well as many national cinemas across the globe have suffered the most significant impact at all levels the interruption of new film productions shutdowns of movie theatres in many countries and the delay of new films release among them many movies made for cinemas were forced to move from theatrical release to various streaming platforms and non traditional production companies continued to grow their market share this book places the global film industry in a post pandemic context it provides detailed analyses of specific systems of film production distribution and consumption in national cinemas as well as hollywood whilst also engaging with the key theoretical and methodological questions from the film studies literature this volume is a critical reference for students and scholars of film studies and general readers who are interested in the new trends and transformation of the global film industry in a post pandemic era

entertainment industrialised is the first study to compare the emergence and economic development of the film industry in britain france and the united states between 1890 and 1940 gerben bakker investigates the commercialisation and industrialisation of live entertainment in the nineteenth century and analyses the subsequent arrival of motion pictures revealing that their emergence triggered a process of incessant creative destruction development and productivity growth that continues in the

entertainment industry today he argues that cinema industrialised live entertainment by automating it standardising it and making it tradeable a process that was largely demand led and that a quality race between firms changed the structure of the international entertainment market while a hundred years ago european enterprises were supplying half of all films shown in the us the quality race resulted in today s industry in which a handful of american companies dominate the global entertainment business publisher s description

looking back through the prism of the severe economic crisis for filmmaking in the 1980s the film industry in brazil explores the unusual relationship between the state supported industry which often produced politically radical films and the authoritarian regime that had held sway for twenty years to ground his analysis johnson covers the early years of the film industry 1898 1930 attempts at industrialization during the 1930s and 1940s film industry congresses and government film boards 1950 1966 the national film institute 1966 1975 and the expansion of the state s role from 1969 through 1980 well conceived carefully researched and documented johnson s study fills a major gap in film studies by tracing the development of this industry in brazil focusing specifically on its relationship to the state
