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a collection of ghost stories with african american themes designed to be told during the dark thirty the half hour before sunset when ghosts seem all too believable with an extraordinary gift for suspense mckissack brings us ten original spine tingling tales inspired by african american history and the mystery of that eerie half hour before nightfall the dark thirty the atmosphere of each selection is skillfully developed and sustained to the very end pinkney s stark scratchboard illustrations evoke an eerie mood which heightens the suspense of each tale this is a stellar collection for both public and school libraries looking for absorbing books to hook young readers storytellers will also find it a goldmine

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ghost stories have played a prominent role in childhood circulated around playgrounds and whispered in slumber parties their history in american literature is little known and seldom discussed by scholars this book explores the fascinating origins and development of these tales focusing on the social and historical factors that shaped them and gave birth to the genre ghost stories have existed for centuries but have been published specifically for children for only about 200 years early on supernatural ghost

stories were rare authors and publishers fearing they might adversely affect young minds presented stories in which the ghost was always revealed as a fraud these tales dominated children's publishing in the 19th century but the 20th century saw a change in perspective and the supernatural ghost story flourished

teaching black speculative fiction equity justice and antiracism edited by kaavonia hinton and karen michele chandler offers innovative approaches to teaching black speculative fiction e g science fiction fantasy horror in ways that will inspire middle and high school students to think talk and write about issues of equity justice and antiracism the book highlights texts by seminal authors such as octavia e butler and influential and emerging authors including nnedi okorafor kacen callender b b alston tomi adeyemi and bethany c morrow each chapter in teaching black speculative fiction introduces a black speculative text and its author describes how the text engages with issues of equity justice and or antiracism explains and describes how one theory or approach helps elucidate the key text's concern with equity justice and or antiracism and offers engaging teaching activities that encourage students to read the focal text that facilitate exploration of the text and a theoretical lens or critical approach and that guide students to consider ways to extend the focus on equity justice and or antiracism to action in their own lives and communities
