transfers part ii labor markets and employment conditions part iii welfare states and regimes part iv and social class relations part v part vi advocates for a more politically engaged approach to population health and presents alternative solutions to achieving egalitarian outcomes which in turn improve health and reduce health inequalities taken together the works in this volume reflect ijhs s collective commitment to publishing high impact studies inspiring fruitful debates and advancing the discipline in new and essential ways emerging and established researchers as well as students and professionals committed to health equity matters will benefit from this book s astute contributions
