The traditional approach of pulling ELLs out of mainstream classrooms for separate ESL instruction is increasingly being challenged Experts advocate for a more integrated approach emphasizing the importance of sheltered instruction within the regular curriculum Dr Jim Cummins a renowned expert in bilingual education emphasizes the importance of cognitively challenging instruction that simultaneously develops language and content knowledge He argues that simply simplifying the language reduces academic rigor hindering longterm learning

- 1 Comprehensive Assessments Beyond standardized tests utilize formative assessments like observations portfolios and informal checks for understanding This allows teachers to gauge a students language proficiency content knowledge and learning styles The use of dynamic assessment which measures a students learning potential with support is particularly valuable
- 2 Differentiated Instruction Tailoring instruction to meet the diverse learning needs of ELLs is paramount This involves adjusting the pace complexity and mode of
