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in this characteristically graceful and provocative book jerome bruner one of the principal architects of the cognitive revolution sets forth nothing less than a new agenda for the study of mind according to professor bruner cognitive science has set its sights too narrowly on the logical systematic aspects of mental life those thought processes we use to solve puzzles test hypotheses and advance explanations there is obviously another side to the mind a side devoted to the irrepressibly human acts of imagination that allow us to make experience meaningful this is the side of the mind that leads to good stories gripping drama primitive myths and rituals and plausible historical accounts bruner calls it the narrative mode and his book makes important advances in the effort to unravel its nature drawing on recent work in literary theory linguistics and symbolic anthropology as well as cognitive and developmental psychology professor bruner examines the mental acts that enter into the imaginative creation of possible worlds and he shows how the activity of imaginary world making undergirds human science literature and philosophy as well as everyday thinking and even our sense of self over twenty years ago jerome bruner first sketched his ideas about the mind's other side in his justly admired book on knowing essays for the left hand actual minds possible worlds can be read as a sequel to this earlier work but it is a sequel that goes well beyond its predecessor by providing rich examples of just how the mind's narrative mode can be successfully studied the collective force of these examples points the way toward a more humane and subtle approach to the investigation of how the mind works

the world according to kant is made up of two levels of reality the transcendental and the empirical the transcendental level is a mind independent level at which things in themselves exist the empirical level is a fully mind dependent level at which appearances exist which are intentional objects of experience the distinction between appearances and things in themselves lies at the heart of kant's critical philosophy and has been the focus of fierce debate among scholars for over two hundred years anja jauernig offers this interpretation of kant's critical idealism as an ontological position which comprises transcendental idealism empirical realism and a number of other basic ontological theses as developed in the critique of pure reason and associated texts in this interpretation kant is a genuine idealist about empirical objects empirical minds and space and time yet in contrast to other intentional objects appearances genuinely exist which is due to both the special character of experience compared to other kinds of representations such as illusions or dreams and to the grounding of appearances in things themselves this is why kant can also be considered a genuine realist about empirical objects empirical minds and space and time this book spells out kant's case for critical idealism thus understood pinpoints the differences between critical idealism and ordinary idealism and clarifies the relation between kant's conception of things in themselves and the conception of things in themselves by other philosophers in particular kant's leibniz wolffian predecessors

this volume is the result of a three year collaboration funded by the american council of learned societies and the british academy between scholars of early china and of ancient hellenistic greece to investigate the emergent discourses of emotions in philosophy medicine and literature from around the fifth century bce to the second century ce it brings together scholars working on the history and philosophy of emotions in the two ancient traditions and with different areas of expertise to investigate the emotions and their conceptualization at a crucial period in the cultural and intellectual development of both cultures the project was

motivated by a desire to make an intervention in the existing scholarship on emotions in both fields which stands to benefit from a greater methodological self awareness about the category of emotions and the kinds of commitments it entails the volume aims to explore how the tools of cross cultural and cross disciplinary investigation might be deployed to advance our understanding of the emotions in the two ancient societies and to use that understanding as a contribution to current research on the emotions more generally

in this collection of essays clifford geertz explores the nature of his anthropological work in relation to a broader public serving as the foremost spokesperson of his generation of scholars those who came of age after world war ii geertz who once considered a career in philosophy begins by explaining how he got swept into the revolutionary movement of symbolic anthropology at that point his work began to encompass not only the ethnography of groups in southeast asia and north africa but also the study of how meaning is made in all cultures or to use his phrase to explore the frames of meaning in which people everywhere live out their lives his philosophical orientation helped him to establish the role of anthropology within broader intellectual circles and led him to address the work of such leading thinkers as charles taylor thomas kuhn william james and jerome bruner in this volume geertz comments on their work as he explores questions in political philosophy psychology and religion that have intrigued him throughout his career but that now hold particular relevance in light of postmodernist thinking and multiculturalism available light offers discussions of concepts such as nation identity country and self with a reminder that like symbols in general their meanings are not categorically fixed but grow and change through time and place

the pioneer of literary anthropology wolfgang iser presents a wide ranging and comprehensive exploration of this new field in an attempt to explain the human need for the particular form of make believe known as literature ranging from the renaissance pastoral to coleridge to sartre and beckett the fictive and the imaginary is a distinguished work of scholarship from one of europe s most respected and influential critics

in a journey to the theoretical roots of human psychology diane gillespie defends the concept of contextualism in a field in which mechanism has prevailed gillespie explains both theories in a historical overview of cognitive psychology and then contrasts them in three chapters on visual perception memory and categorization she clarifies the inadequacy of mechanism as the sole model of cognition by including narratives based on her own life that focus on the dynamic ways we interact with the world providing a subtheme of contemporary concern gillespie argues that a psychological theory open to everyday contexts has important implications for women whose perspectives have been underrepresented in the literature of cognitive psychology she does not posit contextualism as the next exclusive viewpoint but suggests instead a pluralism with no one viewpoint overshadowing the others
