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the best introduction to the work of paul celan this anthology offers a broad collection of his writing in unsurpassed english translations along with a wealth of commentaries by major writers and philosophers the present selection is based on celan s own 1968 selected poems though enlarged to include both earlier and later poems as well as two prose works the meridian celan s core statement on poetics and the narrative conversation in the mountains this volume also includes letters to celan s wife the artist gisèle celan lestrange to his friend erich einhorn and to rené char and jean paul sartre all appearing here for the first time in english

this is a new revised edition of an anvil classic paul celan was one of the great poets of the twentieth century born into a jewish family in a german enclave of romania his life and work were indelibly marked by the holocaust his parents perished in a camp he was lucky to survive the jewish experience and the force of history stretched language and celan himself beyond breaking point celan committed suicide in paris in 1970 but not before he had remade and reclaimed german as a language fit for poets celan spoke of a language north of the future and described his poems as messages in bottles that might never be received

encounters with paul celan's poetry the other's time consists of encounters with poetry with its readers and with the other that poetry seeks to encounter what does it mean when celan insists that every real encounter every true encounter happens in memory of the poetic encounter the secret of the encounter this book presents close readings of various poems often attempting textual and intellectual dialogue with philosophers who read celan or who were read by celan such as jacques derrida werner hamacher edmund husserl hans georg gadamer and maurice merleau ponty

marking paul celan's 100th birthday and the 50th anniversary of his death this volume endeavours to answer the following question why does celan still matter today more than ever

perhaps and why should he continue to matter tomorrow in other words the volume explores and assesses the enduring significance of celan s life and œuvre in and for the 21st century boasting cutting edge research by international scholars together with original contributions by contemporary artists and writers this book attests to on the one hand the extent to which large swathes of contemporary philosophy poetics literary scholarship and aesthetics have been indebted to celan s legacy and are simply unthinkable without it and on the other hand to the malleability adaptability breadth and depth of celan s poetics which like the music of the beatles led zeppelin or queen is reborn and rediscovered with every new generation

paul celan studies in his early poetry scrutinizes the influences detectable in the poems written during 1938 48 among german writers büchner goethe gottfried von strassburg gryphius mörike the poet of the nibelungenlied novalis rilke and trakl all provided motifs that often repeated make for a dense network inviting attention to the self referential and self revealing patterns in celan s early work in addition there are many poems that contain motifs gleaned from greek mythology and or biblical data these references on occasion quite clear more often so obscure as to be hazy allusions yield the view that during his first decade of poetic activities celan becomes increasingly recondite when these references or allusions stand side by side in a given poem they acquire a surrealistic tint and threaten to withhold clear meaning ambiguities deliberately cultivated in the earliest poems begin to boomerang and read like so many preludes to the struggles with language evident in the poetry of celan s maturity it is a certainty that celan reacted quickly if not immediately to the events befalling the scenes of his early years czernowitz and the forced labor camp this phenomenon mandates the view of his poems as so many pieces of autobiography it thus is inevitable that as early as 1940 he wrote against the backdrop of war and soon thereafter in the shadow of the holocaust that was destined to brand his mind forever this volume is meant for anyone interested in celan close reading of modern poetry in general comparative literature motif studies poetic reactions to holocaust events or even in a jew s concept regarding the role of the deity in the destruction of those for whom the poet speaks

paul celan one of the greatest german language poets of the twentieth century created an oeuvre that stands as testimony to the horrors of his times and as an attempt to chart a topography for a new uncontaminated language and world breathturn into timestead the collected later poetry gathers the five final volumes of his life s work in a bilingual edition translated and with commentary by the award winning poet and translator pierre joris this collection displays a mature writer at the height of his talents following what celan himself called the turn wende of his work away from the lush surreal metaphors of his earlier verse given the sinister events in its memory celan believed that the language of poetry had to become more sober more factual grayer abandoning the more sumptuous music of the first books he pared down his compositions to increase the accuracy of the language that now does not transfigure or render poetical it names it posits it tries to measure the area of the given and the possible in his need for an inhabitable post holocaust world celan saw that reality is not simply there it must be searched for and won breathturn into timestead reveals a poet undergoing a profound artistic reinvention the work is that of a witness and a visionary

paul celan has long been regarded as the most important european poet after 1945 but also the most difficult owing to the numerous references in his work to his personal history and to a cultural heritage spanning many disciplines centuries and languages in this insightful study rochelle tobias goes a long way to dispelling the obscurity that has surrounded the poet and his work she shows that the enigmatic images in his poetry have a common source they are drawn from the disciplines of geology astrology and physiology or what could be called the sciences

of the earth the heavens and the human being celan's poetry borrows from each of these disciplines to create a poetic universe a universe that attests to what is no longer and projects what is not yet this is the unnatural world of celan's poetry it is a world in which time itself takes physical form or is made plastic through a series of close readings and philosophical explorations tobias reflects on the experience of time encoded and embodied in celan's work she demonstrates that the physical world in his poetry ultimately serves as a showcase for time which is the most elusive aspect of human experience because it is based nowhere but in the mind tobias's probing interpretations present a new model for understanding celan's work from the early elegiac poems to the later cryptic texts an interdisciplinary project the study combines readings of celan's poetry with discussions of ancient and modern science mystical cosmology and twentieth century literature and thought tobias's original approach to celan illuminates his complex verse and contributes significantly to the theory of metaphor as it applies to modern verse

paul celan's widely recognized as the greatest and most studied post war european poet at once demanding and highly rewarding his poetry dominates the field in the aftermath of the holocaust this selection of poems now available in paper for the first time is comprised of previously untranslated work opening facets of celan's oeuvre never before available to readers of english these translations called perfect in language music and spirit by yehuda amichai work from the implied premise of what has been called intention auf die sprache delivering the spirit of celan's work his dense multilingual resonances his brutal broken music syntactic ruptures and dizzying wordplay

in the immediate aftermath of world war ii paul celan moved to bucharest where he spent more than two years working as a translator at carta rusa publishing house during that time he was introduced to poet and translator petre solomon and began a close friendship that would endure many years despite the distances that separated them and the turbulent times in which they lived in this poignant memoir solomon recalls the experiences he shared with celan and captures the ways in which bucharest profoundly influenced celan's evolution as a poet he recounts the publication of the famous todesfuge for the first time in the romanian magazine

agora and his fertile connection with the romanian surrealist movement through solomon s vivid recollection and various letters celan sent to friends readers also get an intimate glimpse of celan s personality one characterized by a joyful appreciation of friendship and a subtle sense of humor translated from the original tegla s edition makes this remarkable memoir available to a much deserved wider audience for the first time

paul celan 1920 1970 stands as one of the greatest post war european poets a writer whose painful struggle with the possibilities and limitations of german his native language has helped to define the response of poetry in the aftermath of the holocaust the writings and aphorisms on poetry and art illuminate the sources of his language he explores the condition of being a stranger in the world the necessity and limitation of discourse enlarging our understanding of the poet and his vocation a spare and reluctant prose writer celan speaks with a quiet authority that insists on the centrality of poetry in the modern world book jacket

contents shibboleth for paul celan a self unsealing poetic text poetics and politics of witnessing language does not belong an interview the majesty of the present reading celan s the meridian rams uninterrupted dialogue between two infinities the poemthis book brings together five powerful encounters themes central to all of derrida s writings thread the intense confrontation between the most famous philosopher of our time and the jewish poet writing in german who perhaps more powerfully than any other has testified to the european experience of the twentieth century they include the date or signature and its singularity the notion of the trace temporal structures of futurity and the to come the multiplicity of language and questions of translation such speech acts as testimony and promising but also lying and perjury the possibility of the impossible and above all the question of the poem as addressed and destined beyond knowledge seeking to speak to and for the irreducibly other the

memory of encounters with thinkers who have also engaged celan's work animates these writings which include a brilliant dialogue between two interpretative modes: hermeneutics and deconstruction. Derrida's approach to a poem is a revelation on many levels from the most concrete ways of reading for example his analysis of a sequence of personal pronouns to the most sweeping imperatives of human existence and Derrida's writings are always a study in the imbrication of such levels. Above all he voices the call to responsibility in the ultimate line of Celan's poem: "The world is gone, I must carry you" which sounds throughout the book's final essay like a refrain. Only two of the texts in this volume do not appear here in English for the first time. Of these, Schibboleth has been entirely retranslated and has been set following Derrida's own instructions for publication in French. A self-unsealing poetic text was substantially rewritten by Derrida himself and basically appears here as the translation of a new text. Jacques Derrida's most recent books in English translation include *Counterpath*, *Traveling with Jacques Derrida* with Catherine Malabou. He died in Paris on October 8, 2004. Thomas Dutoit teaches at the Université de Paris 7. He translated *Aporias* and edited on the name both by Jacques Derrida.

Paul Celan, who has long been recognized as the most important poet of the German language after World War II, repeatedly referred to music and song in his poetic oeuvre, and few writers of the post-war era have inspired as large a body of musical settings by contemporary composers. Englund addresses music both as a thematic and structural presence in the poems themselves and as their sounding interlocutor in musical works by Harrison Birtwistle, Georgy Kurtág, Wolfgang Rihm, Peter Ruzicka, and many others.

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
