in the five colored clouds of mount wutai poems from dunhuang mary anne cartelli examines a set of poems from the dunhuang manuscripts about mount wutai the most sacred mountain in chinese buddhism dating from the tang and five dynasties periods they reflect the mountain's transformation into the home of the bodhisattva mañjuśrī and provide important literary evidence for the development of buddhism in china this interdisciplinary study analyzes the poems using buddhist scriptures and pilgrimage records as well as the contemporaneous wall painting of mount wutai in dunhuang cave 61 the poems demonstrate how the mountain was created as a sacred buddhist space as their motifs reflect the cosmology associated with the mountain by the tang dynasty and they vividly portray the experience of the pilgrim traveling through a divinely empowered landscape

poetry edited by anne tardos and michael o driscoll the sixty poems in this collection were written over an extended stretch of the poet's life beginning on june 10 1962 and concluding on october 9 1988 more than twenty six years later the poems then were begun by mac low aged 39 and completed or perhaps left off when he was 66 years old as the work of an accomplished artist at mid life the poems express a certain self confidence and maturity at the same time as they are all too vulnerable in their frank recognition of the frailties of self and love the complete light poems are often very moving for that reason and given their intensely biographical nature the poems afford the reader an unusually prolonged and intimate sense of the poet's daily life i have often wondered where self referential writing ends and objective observation begins endearingly mac low continually invites us into the time and place of his writing we are as it were being let in from the cold just me the cats and the plants i just took a shower it's not quite 100 degrees here anne tardos

light in the darkness and darkness in the light from the gloom of dark shadows to the shimmer of sunlight and back again from the explosions of passion to the quiet tender glow of serenity from despair and agony to hope and love from sorrow and anguish back once again to a world of love and hope awakening to a fresh and joyful beginning from indescribable beauty to incomprehensible ugliness and pain and then onward to a new vision of breathtaking beauty born anew you are invited to experience the world in a way that you may never have seen or felt before stimulate the mind and the senses experience a different sort of poetry book how can this be read on taste and see learn about all these things and yes still more a few things that were never quite envisioned before

*i live like a vandal in the big city everywhere i go i break off small pieces of glass furtively making sure nobody catches me at my selfish strange act i take these pieces and write my poems carefully assembled balls of glass that make visions in the light this is my glass ball legacy no one will see it just the same how many people do we have to meet how many mistakes do we have to make how many times do we have to cry before we become the people we are meant to be how do we know who we're meant to be am i just an ongoing poem or am i the epiphany at the end this book is a beginning it is a collection of firsts the life cycle of a caterpillar as it tries to become a butterfly it is the time after the light leaves the stars and before it reaches our eyes it is a question that decides to get up and find its own answer *Light Time* is a collection of poems about feeling being and becoming it is a search for truth identity and happiness in the confusing haze of slowly growing up this poem maybe you will read it and find some truth tell me won't you maybe it won't be the truth of this poem but since i'm writing it and i don't know what it is maybe there isn't one maybe you'll find something*

Carson in this collection nods to his poetic influences he dedicates for a time to poet John Hoagland and the poetry of my final days to Donald Hall and he explicitly references W.S. Merwin and Mark Strand in the poetry of my final days and the bookish *Light* respectively poems from this collection have appeared in *Eunoia* review *Rumble Fish* quarterly right hand pointing gyroscope the poetry porch oddball magazine dunes review boog city poetry leaves crosswinds toho journal south dakota in poems blood and thunder musings on the art of medicine Monday night and color story*
