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this unique volume focuses on the development of chinese as a second language csl teachers in the global context it addresses the specific issues and challenges faced by csl teachers and demonstrates international practices in the field it also provides a comprehensive examination of their multifaceted professionalism from diverse perspectives with the rise of china as a political and economic power learning csl has increasingly gained its popularity in a global context according to the chinese international education foundation by 2023 the number of registered chinese language learners exceeded 12 5 million due to the shortage of teachers the ministry of education in china launched the international chinese language teachers volunteer program in 2004 by 2021 more than 61 000 volunteer chinese language teachers had been dispatched to more than 151 regions and countries many more overseas universities colleges and higher institutes now have established csl programmes at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels to cultivate local csl teachers however as the number of csl

learners continues to grow the need for high quality chinese language teachers has become more urgent than ever responding to csl teachers challenges of delivering chinese language and culture to learners from diverse language and cultural backgrounds this book explores four interrelated themes 1 csl teachers professional development in the global context 2 csl teachers motivation agency and identity 3 csl teachers knowledge and practice in multicultural and multilingual contexts and 4 csl teachers technological literacy and agency in the digital era with its focus on both the internal and external complexities of csl teacher development the book offers timely insights and practical guidance for researchers educators policymakers and frontline teachers working in this rapidly expanding field

the book is a collection of five significant articles that highlight professor baokui qu s research on the evolution of the educational discipline in china the classification of educational sciences and the metatheory of education one of the features of his research on these topics is that he integrated the perspectives from scholars in many countries and reflected critically on the past and future of education as a discipline

this book discusses the use of futures methodologies to examine and critique teacher education and investigate drivers of change in teacher education contexts providing readers with futures tools that they can use to explore curricula and pedagogies it explains futures methods including scenario development and backcasting and illustrates them with examples of research in science technology and mathematics education contexts by allowing the long term influence of current trends to be considered and providing an opportunity to reflect on the present and imagine the future scenarios provoke discussion on the directions that teacher education might take now the book offers insights into the possibilities that might exist for teacher education futures and into how scenario building and planning can be used to inform debates about the present further it suggests ways in which readers can influence the future of teacher education through understanding the drivers of change

this book offers the first full length treatment of the topic of debating as a method of developing english foreign language efl speaking inviting scholars and practitioners to reflect on the demands of the current age for moving forward educational practice while debating is a well known method of dialogic speaking and is widely practiced the extent to which it is integrated in adult tefl has not been established and an understanding of its affordances for developing foreign language speaking is also limited this book fills the gap in the field of tesol and applied linguistics on the affordances of debating as a form of dialogic speaking that can promote a holistic understanding and improvement of experience of education and indeed academic outcomes the two main themes that situate the work are those of dialogic speaking and affect at times referred to as humanistic positive psychology and social and emotional learning the book details the experiences of an adult efl debate group in a private language school in the north of italy it reports how the participants experience the pedagogy so as to offer insights into it as a form of teaching speaking in adult efl as well as providing a practical framework with lesson plans and curriculum the affordances of debating emerge as being social cognitive educational and communicative and are discussed alongside the work of language teaching scholars curran and freire and

more broadly within a social constructivist approach to education as such debating is discussed as being a holistic and dialogic form of pedagogy particular attention to experience often affective is also found to be fundamental in planning and assessing educational outcomes for both teachers and learners

the latest title in the popular spotlight series this timely book focuses on recruitment and retention of music teachers a crucial issue in these days of budget constraints arranged chronologically it features a collection of articles from state journals focusing on issues such as mentoring teacher shortages burnout and professional development options

the curriculum of public policy education is currently undergoing an introspective examination as academics and practitioners develop programs to reflect the dramatic theoretical informational technological and managerial changes of the 1980s this book is a response to some of these creative and innovative instructional techniques the text covers policy theory research and a number of substantive topics including financial management budgeting ethics computers and experiential learning the essays are grouped in seven separate areas each emphasizing successful teaching strategies organizational theory is the first area to be treated with discussions of public administration education and democratic values a reflection in action model and the role of ethics in public policy education research skills are covered through surveys of quantitative analysis skills of mpa students and bridging the gap between methods courses and real research studies surveys of information resource management and an active reactive model of policy evaluation comprise the section on program evaluation and management while financial core curriculum courses are considered in chapters on in class budget simulations and fiscal management in the public sector a computers and communications section focuses on computer literacy and the skills an mpa program should teach and two contributions analyze comparative public administration finally a concluding section explores the contemporary issues of the use of practitioners in the classroom experiential learning and the political science perspective on public administration this volume will be a useful resource for courses in public administration public policy and political science as well as a welcome addition to public and academic libraries
