3 general wellness and physical activity programs and 4 mental health programs additionally articles are included to discuss cross cutting issues related to building partnerships and the research infrastructure for the implementation evaluation and dissemination of evidence based programming the intent of this research topic is to enhance practice inform policy and build systems of support and delivery for ebp it is written for a diverse audience and contains practical implications and recommendations for introducing delivering and sustaining ebp in a multitude of settings
