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what makes a good college teacher this book provides an evidence based answer to that question by presenting a set of model teaching characteristics that define what makes a good college teacher based on six fundamental areas of teaching competency known as model teaching characteristics outlined by the society for the teaching of psychology stp this book describes how college faculty from all disciplines and at all levels of experience can use these characteristics to evaluate guide and improve their teaching evidence based research supports the inclusion of each characteristic each of which is

illustrated through example to help readers master the skills readers learn to evaluate their teaching abilities by providing guidance on what to document and how to accumulate and organize the evidence two introductory chapters outline the model teaching characteristics followed by six chapters each devoted to one of the characteristics training instructional methods course content assessment syllabus construction and student evaluations the book features in each chapter self evaluation surveys that help readers identify gaps between the model characteristics and their own teaching case studies that illustrate common teaching problems discussion questions that encourage critical thinking and additional readings for further exploration discusses the need to master teaching skills such as collaborative learning listening and using technology as well as discipline specific knowledge advocates for the use of student learning outcomes to help teachers better evaluate student performance based on their achievement of specific learning goals argues for the development of learning objectives that reflect the core of the discipline s theories and applications strengthen basic liberal arts skills and infuse ethical and diversity issues discusses how to solicit student feedback and utilize these evaluations to improve teaching intended for professional development or teacher training courses offered in masters and doctoral programs in colleges and universities this book is also an invaluable resource for faculty development centers college and university administrators and college teachers of all levels and disciplines from novice to the most experienced interested in becoming more effective teachers

this book focuses on plant systematics and evolution with special interest on the history and philosophy of botanical classification tracing the history of how humans have dealt with ordering the plant world is very much a glimpse of how human culture and science have progressed over the past 2000 years the objective in this book is to present ideas on plant classification beginning with classical greek and roman scholars through the middle ages into the renaissance and finally to the modern 21st century significant quantitative methods in classification have originated within the past 70 years which have never before been integrated with previous historical perspectives most textbooks of systematic botany contain an historical introduction or perhaps a chapter on the history of classification but this book presents much greater detail on the classifications themselves and the cultural dimensions of the different time periods biographical detail is also provided to give a better appreciation of the individual botanists who have contributed new ideas in the search for maximally predictive systems

this concise guidebook is intended for faculty who are interested in engaging their students and developing deep and lasting learning but do not have the time to immerse themselves in the scholarship of teaching and learning acknowledging the growing body of peer reviewed literature on practices that can dramatically impact teaching this intentionally brief book summarizes recent research on six of the most compelling principles in learning and teaching

be a very long time know well that when evaluation and measurement criteria are demanded as evidence of drama's efficacy an examiner stands as gatekeeper when the educational landscape is in danger of overcrowding we meet a territorial governor and how often has the courtesan turned out to be only a tease because the arts are for a brief moment in the spotlight for their abilities to foster out of the box thinkers in this text we meet these commissionaires and many more the gatekeeping roles and what they represent are so familiar that they have become clichés to us we know them by their arguments ripostes dismissals their brief encouragement and lack of follow up and we know that behind each one however firmly they think they keep the keys is a financial and political master whose power controls the curriculum building and everything in it

assesses john dewey's visit to china in 1919-21 as an intra-cultural episode and promotes chinese natural philosophy as a philosophical context in which to understand the connections between dewey's philosophy and early confucian thinking in this conclusion to his two volume series jim behuniak builds upon the groundbreaking work begun in john dewey and daoist thought in arguing that chinese natural philosophy is the proper hermeneutical context in which to understand early confucianism first he traces dewey's late period cultural turn in more detail and then proceeds to assess dewey's visit to china in 1919-21 as a multifaceted intra-cultural episode one that includes not only what dewey taught his chinese audiences but also what he learned in china and what we stand to learn from this encounter today dewey in china provides an opportunity to continue establishing specific philosophical relationships between dewey and confucian thought for the purpose of getting ourselves back in gear with contemporary thinking in the social and natural sciences to this end behuniak

critically assesses readings of early chinese thought reliant on outdated greek medieval assumptions paying particular attention to readings of early confucianism that rely heavily on western virtue ethics such as the heaven s plan reading topics covered include education tradition ethics the family human nature and religiousness thus engaging dewey with themes generally associated with confucian thought attacking the distinction of eastern versus western philosophical cultures these volumes create a detailed intra cultural deweyan chinese thought on many levels at once using dewey to reinterpret the daoist and confucian traditions from their sources behuniak weaves an intra cultural philosophical trajectory that stretches from the sixth century bce china to columbia university in new york city the result is one of the philosophical masterpieces of our time robert cummings neville professor emeritus of philosophy religion and theology boston university
