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to diagnose a mental disorder or make a disability determination clinicians must assess functional impairment not just the presence of symptoms meeting a key need the barkley functional impairment scale children and adolescents bfis ca is an empirically based norm referenced tool that exceeds other available scales in its comprehensive coverage of domains of psychosocial impairment the bfis ca is designed to obtain parent reports on possible impairment in 15 different domains of everyday activities for children and teens the scale typically takes a parent 5 7 minutes to complete also included is a follow up parent

interview form for obtaining more information about specific problem areas complete instructions for scoring and interpreting the scale are provided age range 6-17 see also the barkley deficits in executive functioning scale children and adolescents bdfs ca which assesses clinically significant executive functioning difficulties includes permission to photocopy enhancing the convenience and value of the bfis ca the limited photocopy license allows purchasers to reproduce the forms and score sheets and yields considerable cost savings over other available scales the large format and sturdy wire binding facilitate photocopying

this book examines the literacy development and assessment of children before the age of five years it is highly relevant to all those professionally involved in assessment cathy nutbrown explores the need for appropriate assessment practice to support teachers and illustrates the mismatch between the way teachers and researchers assess literacy the book is worth buying for the final chapter alone which provides an analysis of the newly developed sheffield early literacy development profile the actual tasks are included in the appendices thus cathy nutbrown does not leave us frustrated we are able to consider an ongoing assessment which is in tune with the best practice in teaching this is a research text which balances theory with practical realism it is particularly relevant today with the introduction of baseline assessment teachers and researchers will find much that they can relate to and learn from it is clearly written and deserves to be widely read however it may make for uncomfortable reading as cathy nutbrown challenges all concerned with the assessment of early literacy development to reflect on exactly what they are doing and why british educational research recognising early literacy development presents a new view of the many purposes of assessment in early literacy development issues in early literacy assessment current assessment material the purposes of literacy assessment government policy practice in schools baseline assessment of literacy the need for new research measures of early literacy are all recurrent themes of the book the author reviews and discusses three decades of policy and practice in assessing literacy development in the years 3 to 5 from recognising in the late 1960s that literacy in these years exists to proposals in 1997 for official assessment of literacy at 5 years

what is hypnosis despite widespread misconceptions hypnosis is not a treatment in itself instead it is a facilitator a useful diagnostic tool that can help the practitioner choose an appropriate treatment modality and accelerate various primary treatment strategies the second edition of this remarkable work first published 25 years ago is written to provide both beginning and seasoned practitioners with a brief disciplined technique for mobilizing and learning from an individual's capacity to concentrate putting to rest both exaggerated fears about hypnosis and overblown statements of its efficacy this compelling volume brings scientific discipline to a systematic exploration of the clinical uses and limitations of hypnosis the challenge was to develop a clinical measurement that could transform a fascinating amalgam of anecdotes speculations clinical intuitions and observations and laboratory advances into a more fruitful and systematic body of information thus was born the authors hypnotic induction profile hip a crucial 10 minute clinical assessment procedure that relates the spectrum of hypnotizability to personality style psychopathology and treatment outcome structured to reflect the flow of a typical evaluation and treatment session and highlighted by case examples throughout this remarkable synthesis describes how to use the hip reviews relevant literature and details principles and short and long term treatment strategies for smoking control eating disorders anxiety concentration and insomnia phobias pain control psychosomatic disorders and conversion symptoms trichotillomania stuttering and acute and posttraumatic stress disorders and dissociation meticulously referenced and indexed this in depth work concludes with an appendix on the interpretation and standardization of the hip this unique work stands out in the literature because it is written both as an introduction for practitioners new to hypnosis and as an in depth guide for practitioners with wide experience in hypnosis unlike current clinical works it emphasizes the importance of performing a systematic assessment of hypnotizability to identify measure and utilize a given patient's optimal therapeutic potential a process that until now has been relegated to clinical intuition it describes human behavior phenomenologically as it relates to hypnosis in a probable rather than an absolute fashion it reviews only specific portions of the literature that are particularly relevant to the important themes presented by the authors wherever possible the authors apply statistical methods to test their hypotheses the realm of scientific investigation encompassing hypnosis and psychological dysfunction is comparatively new this exceptional volume with its profusion of systematic data will spark controversy and interest among scientific students of hypnosis everywhere from psychiatrists psychologists and psychoanalysts to physicians dentists and other interested clinicians

of the compendium was named as one of the eleven essential books in their field this second edition has been thoroughly updated to cover new developments in neuroscience cognitive psychology and psychological assessment it includes new chapters on test selection report writing and informing the client executive functions occupational interest and aptitude and the assessment of functional complaints in addition to updating research findings about the tests covered in the first edition the book now contains almost twice as many tests

for the practicing neuropsychologist or researcher keeping up with the sheer number of newly published or updated tests is a challenge as is evaluating the utility and psychometric properties of neuropsychological tests in a clinical context the goal of the third edition of a compendium of neuropsychological tests a well established neuropsychology reference text is twofold first the compendium is intended to serve as a guidebook that provides a comprehensive overview of the essential aspects of neuropsychological assessment practice second it is intended as a comprehensive sourcebook of critical reviews of major neuropsychological assessment tools for the use by practicing clinicians and researchers written in a comprehensive easy to read reference format and based on exhaustive review of research literature in neuropsychology neurology psychology and related disciplines the book covers topics such as basic aspects of neuropsychological assessment as well as the theoretical background norms and the utility reliability and validity of neuropsychological tests for this third edition all chapters have been extensively revised and updated the text has been considerably expanded to provide a comprehensive yet practical overview of the state of the field two new chapters have been added psychometrics in neuropsychological assessment and norms in psychological assessment the first two chapters present basic psychometric concepts and principles chapters three and four consider practical aspects of the history taking interview and the assessment process itself chapter five provides guidelines on report writing and chapters six through sixteen consist of detailed critical reviews of neuropsychological tests and address the topics of intelligence achievement executive function attention memory language visual perception somatosensory olfactory function mood personality and response bias a unique feature is the inclusion of tables that summarize salient features of tests within each domain so that readers can easily compare measures additional tables within each test review summarize important features of each test highlight aspects of each normative dataset and provide an overview of psychometric properties of interest to neuropsychologists neurologists psychiatrists and educational and clinical psychologists working with adults as well as pediatric populations this volume will aid practitioners in selecting appropriate testing measures for their patients and will provide them with the knowledge needed to make empirically supported interpretations of test results
