a guide to teaching introductory physics from high school to calculus based college courses this instructional tool presents systematic observations based upon research into how physics students come to learn and understand physical concepts models and lines of reasoning includes many examples of test questions and homework problems

numerous teaching learning assessment and institutional innovations in undergraduate science technology engineering and mathematics stem education have emerged in the past decade because virtually all of these innovations have been developed independently of one another their goals and purposes vary widely some focus on making science accessible and meaningful to the vast majority of students who will not pursue stem majors or careers others aim to increase the diversity of students who enroll and succeed in stem courses and programs still other efforts focus on reforming the overall curriculum in specific disciplines in addition to this variation in focus these innovations have been implemented at scales that range from individual classrooms to entire departments or institutions by 2008 partly because of this wide variability it was apparent that little was known about the feasibility of replicating individual innovations or about their potential for broader impact beyond the specific contexts in which they were created the research base on innovations in undergraduate stem education was expanding rapidly but the process of synthesizing that knowledge base had not yet begun if future investments were to be informed by the past then the field clearly needed a retrospective look at the ways in which earlier innovations had influenced undergraduate stem education to address this need the national research council nrc convened two public workshops to examine the impact and effectiveness of selected stem undergraduate education innovations this volume summarizes the workshops which addressed such topics as the link between learning goals and evidence promising practices at the individual faculty and institutional levels classroom based promising practices and professional development for graduate students new faculty and veteran faculty the workshops concluded with a broader examination of the barriers and opportunities associated with systemic change

this book starts with the premise that beauty can be an engine of transformation and authentic engagement in an increasingly complex world it presents an organized picture of highlights from the 13th european science education research association conference esera 2019 held in bologna italy the collection includes contributions that discuss contemporary issues such as climate change multiculturalism and the flourishing of new interdisciplinary areas of investigation including the application of cognitive neuroscience artificial intelligence and digital humanities to science education research it also highlights learners difficulties engaging with socio scientific issues in a digital and post truth era the volume demonstrates that deepening our understanding is the preferred way to address these challenges and that science education has a key role to play in this effort in particular the book advances the argument that the deep and novel character of these challenges requires a collective search for new narratives and languages an expanding knowledge base and new theoretical perspectives and methods of research the book provides a contemporary picture of science education research and looks to the theoretical and practical societal challenges of the future

the unique content and characteristic pedagogies of major disciplines each chapter begins by summarizing the sotl literature on the pedagogies of a specific discipline and by examining and analyzing its traditional practices paying particular attention to how faculty evaluate success each concludes by the articulating for its discipline the elements of a signature pedagogy that will improve teaching and learning and by offering an agenda for future research each chapter explores what the pedagogical literature of the discipline suggests are the optimal ways to teach material in that field and to verify the resulting learning each author is concerned about how to engage students in the ways of knowing the habits of mind and the values used by experts in his or her field readers will not only benefit from the chapters most relevant to their disciplines as faculty members consider how their courses fit into the broader curriculum and relate to the other disciplines and design learning activities and goals not only within the discipline but also within the broader objectives of liberal education they will appreciate the cross disciplinary understandings this book affords
